MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you and your family have had an enjoyable summer; it has been wonderful to welcome your children back to college this week and to hear all that they have been up to, including Year 11 talking about their work experience placements which happened in the last week of term. These have prepared them well for their final year at Wyvern, focusing them on the need to work hard for their GCSE exams.

I am delighted with the GCSE exam results from this summer. Once again, Wyvern students have achieved significantly better grades than the national average, across all the core subjects of English, Maths Science, Humanities (Geography, History) and Languages. Attainment is now well above the national average in all these subjects for top passes (9-7), strong passes (9-5) and good passes (9-4). Building on the excellent results from 2023, we have seen an increase in the proportion of all grades across all subjects that were 7 or higher, 6 or higher, 5 or higher and 4 or higher. This is especially pleasing as nationally the proportion of grades at many of these levels decreased. We had students who attained grade 9 in all of their subjects. But we have also seen the effects of our more inclusive approaches to teaching: results for boys were just as good as for girls (there is not the gender gap that exists nationally); students with a special education need and those joining us with low attainment from junior school have achieved some of the best results in our college's history; the gap between those from disadvantaged backgrounds and other students has reduced and in terms of ethnicity, there is no difference in performance.

I would like to congratulate the class of 2024 for these achievements. I would like to thank all those parents who had children in Year 11 last year; we enjoyed working closely with you to support your children achieve these results. Two of the reasons why this year group did so well was because their attendance and the number of achievement points they earned were both higher than any year group that has come through Wyvern before. Hard work and strong attendance are more significant causes of success than anything else, including prior attainment. In the college we have a great quote from Carol Dweck, whose work on the Growth Mindset has changed the way people view academic success: "*it's not always the people who start out the smartest who end up the smartest; it's the people who work the hardest.*"

Although we are pleased with these results, we are not complacent. We will continue to reflect on how we can improve further; on what we can learn from the highest performing schools in the country and how we can ensure greater consistency between subjects. We have lots to learn as professionals. On Monday's INSET day, teachers studied the information about the students in their new classes and how they can provide the right levels of support and challenge for them. We also launched our new praise, rewards, and achievement policy with staff which we hope will incentivise good behaviour.

We have also welcomed the new Year 7 students to our college this week. They have had an excellent first few days; we have seen them working hard and keen to impress staff. They have made a very positive first impression. We hope they will get involved in the many opportunities they will find at Wyvern and grow to become just as successful as our Year 11 leavers.

We are thrilled to welcome you and your child back to Wyvern for the 2024-2025 academic year! We hope your child is as excited as we are to begin another year of learning, growth, and community building. We have several exciting developments this year that are designed to enhance students' engagement and enjoyment of school. In this edition of our newsletter, I would like to share two of these exciting new initiatives with you.

Introducing Our Brand-New House System

We are delighted to announce the launch of our brand-new house system at Wyvern! Every student will now belong to one of five houses: Centaur, Gryphon, Dragon, Hippogriff, or Phoenix. Each house will include two tutor groups from each year, from Year 7 to Year 11, creating a dynamic mix of students across different year groups.



Here's how our house system will work:

- **House Assemblies:** Each half term, we will hold house assemblies to celebrate achievements and launch new house competitions. The first house assemblies will take place in Week 3.
- **House Competitions:** Students can earn points for their house by participating in various competitions. Every participant contributes to their house's total, fostering a sense of teamwork and friendly competition.
- **Staff Involvement:** All staff members, except Mr. Rule, are also part of a house and will participate in staff competitions throughout the year to contribute points towards their house.
- **The House Cup:** At the end of the year, on Sports Day during the summer term, the house with the most points will be awarded the coveted House Cup!

We believe this new house system will build camaraderie, encourage collaboration, and promote school spirit among our students and staff. We look forward to seeing the positive impact it will have on our school community.

Our New Achievement Strategy

Alongside our new house system, we are also excited to introduce a revamped achievement strategy designed to motivate and reward students more consistently. Here's how it works:

- House Points: Students will earn house points based on their achievements:
 - P1: Awarded when a student meets our expectations, earning 1 house point.
 - P2: Awarded when a student exceeds our expectations, earning 10 house points.
 - P3: Awarded for exceptional achievements, earning 50 house points.
- **Parental Notifications:** You will receive a notification via Edulink each time your child earns house points, giving you the opportunity to celebrate their successes with them. Postcards and letters will be sent home for P2 and P3 achievements too.
- -Milestone Rewards: For every 50 house points earned, you and your child will receive an email. As students progress from 50 to 100, 150, and beyond, they will achieve various awards named after local

and UK landmarks. These milestones are designed to encourage a sense of achievement and motivate students to keep striving for excellence.

- Celebration Events: We will continue to host our popular Celebration Breakfasts and introduce a new event, Breakfast with the Headteacher, for students who achieve the highest average PRIDE scores. Additionally, we are excited to announce Subject Awards Evenings for Years 7 to 10, which will take place in the summer term to celebrate academic achievements across the curriculum. Parents will be invited to join us for these special evenings.
- End-of-Year Praise Trips: In Week 5, we will launch our brand-new end-of-year praise trips for students who meet specific criteria around behaviour, attendance, and punctuality. More details will be shared soon.

We hope these new initiatives will provide students with even more reasons to strive for excellence and feel valued for their efforts. We believe in celebrating the achievements of our students and recognising the hard work they put in every day.

We are incredibly excited about these new developments and are confident that they will contribute to a positive, vibrant school culture where every student feels motivated and supported. Thank you for your continued support as we work together to make this the best school year yet!

YEAR 9 NOTICES

Dear parents of Year 9

I hope your son / daughter has had a positive first week back at college and that they are beginning to settle back in after the summer holidays.

Options:

Over the next few weeks students will begin to get a feel for their option choices and in most cases they will no doubt be delighted with their selections.

I visited Year 9 assembly earlier this week to remind them that if they are not happy they need to chat to their teacher in the first instance and then come and see me if they wish to consider a change.

With the timetable in place the options available to change into will now be limited and the window for changing options closes on Friday 27th September after 4 weeks of lessons.

Science Pathways:

In Year 9 we also begin to move towards Science Pathways with the default being that all students will study Combined Science, which is equivalent to two GCSEs.

Students who have science class codes 9L1 / 9L2 / 9R1 on their timetable are on the Triple Science Pathway which can lead to students entering GCSEs in Biology, Chemistry and Physics at the end of Year 11. You will also see that they have 5 Science lessons per week on their timetable.

Over the next few years some students may step down to the combined course if they struggle with the additional content.

However, if your son / daughter wishes to be considered for Triple Science and they are <u>not</u> in one of these classes it is important you contact your current Science teacher as soon as possible. Any request for a student to be moved into the Triple Pathway will be considered based on prior attainment in science assessments, PRIDe scores and attendance.
