Attendance

Following my comments a few weeks ago about declining attendance levels, which had dipped for three weeks below the national average, I am delighted to see that attendance has increased and is now back to where we expect it to be - above the national average. Thank you for working so well with us to achieve this. We appreciate how many of you have acted on the absence reports that went home after half term and how many of you have acted on the NHS guidance we shared on when to send a sick child into college and when not too. We do need to maintain this improved attendance for the last two weeks and also recognise that it is still below where it needs to be - at 95%.

It is frightening to think that we only have three weeks of this term left as Christmas now races towards us! Hopefully you have seen the announcement about the Christmas lunch which is due to take place on Wednesday 11th December. Tutor Reps will spend period 3 decorating the tables and a prize will be awarded for the best dressed table.

Mr Rule delivered assembly this week and it was wonderful to see how the Year 8 data looked. Mr Rule showed figures that illustrated that 91% of students in the year group have never had a detention since joining Wyvern. He reflected on the proportion of students who have experienced our most serious sanctions (6%) and the concept of a small minority of students who are “entitled” and who behave in a way that reflects their mindset of “the rules don’t apply to me” and “I can do what I like”. Mr Rule used the character comparisons of Veruca Salt from Willy Wonka and Dudley Dursley from Harry Potter to help students to understand what “entitled” looks like. The 91% were acknowledged as the hard-working and cooperative members of the year group who are contributing, as they should, in a positive way to our college and hopefully were reassured by our

Head Teacher's message that the minority either need to change their behaviours or face the longer-term consequences.

So, in terms of praise news this week - I would like to congratulate P2 for earning the highest number of P1s last week (465) followed by H1 (394) and in third place G2 (379). The leader board for students last week is as follows Sophie H1 was in first place with 31 P1s, Freddie from P2 with 30 and in third place Amber from P2 with 27 points – well done! Again, thanks to those parents who have sent in prize donations for our Christmas Celebration Assembly, and it is not too late if you still have something to send in.
