Dear Parents/Carers

7th January 2025

With only a few more days to go before the Christmas break, there is no let-up in the activities around the school. Years 7, 8 and 9 have now had their Christmas lunches: each tutor group decorated their tables in competition to win house points and a prize; they ate their meal together, pulled crackers, wore their Christmas jumpers, sang along to Christmas songs, and played quizzes and games. Students are also busy decorating their tutor group classrooms, again in an inter-house competition. Other are preparing for our concert next week. Through my assemblies this term I have managed to make references to my favourite novel: A Christmas Carol which our students study for their GCSEs. One of the important messages of this novel is that the Christmas spirit of charity, kindness and care for others is something we should show all year round. But at Christmas time there is a particular opportunity for us to reach out to others beyond our circle of families and friends; whether that is to neighbours who we vaguely know or, through charity, those we do not know.

Beginning of Spring Term

We were delighted to welcome a number of our Trustees (Governors) into college to undertake learning walks with college leaders. A learning walk is when a member of staff visits the classrooms of others to identify best practice, check college processes are being followed and provide feedback on how things can be even better. We are focusing this year on making learning more active, collaborative, and engaging, as well as ensuring teachers regularly check that students are understanding what they are teaching. We very much appreciate the support that our Trustees give the college throughout the year.

The Year 11 trial exams are now coming to an end and the particularly good behaviour and conduct of students was specifically commented upon by some external visitors earlier in the week, which is lovely to hear. Teachers will now be marking their papers and updating their predictions for students' grades in the summer. I do hope that year 11 students get to have some time off from their studies over the holidays.

Safeguarding

Parental mental health problems are not in themselves a child safeguarding concern. However, case reviews show that without the right support a parent with poor mental health can sometimes struggle to provide the safe and loving care for their child that they would like to provide. Parental mental health often suffers with the pressures of Christmas and sadly many do not know where they can get help and support if they need it.

You might know this service by its previous name: Parentline). You can call them on 0808 800 2222 for emotional support, information, advice and guidance on any aspect of parenting and family life. If you don't get an answer first time please do try again. All calls, emails and chats are confidential. They will only break confidentiality if there is a life-threatening situation, or a child or adult is felt to be at risk of significant harm. Calls are not recorded.

The **Stop Domestic Abuse** service number is 0330 0533 630 and this will also take you through to the **Hampshire Advice line** number 0330 0165 112. If you are in an emergency situation you should phone 999 and if it is unsafe for you to speak you can press 55 after 999.

Post 16 Transport Consultation

This is a reminder that <u>Hampshire County Council's consultation on its Post 16 Transport Policy</u> is open until Sunday, 15 December.

The policy outlines the County Council's transport provision for young people over 16 with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) travelling to further education or training. The consultation seeks feedback on a number of small, proposed changes to make the policy easier to understand and provide greater clarity on how the service is delivered and managed. The proposals are not part of a savings programme.
