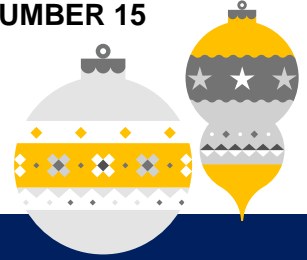

Dear Parents/Carers

I had great pleasure in watching our students performed at our Christmas concert this week, in a range of choirs, bands and ensembles. These were wonderful evenings, and I would like to thank all those students who attended and the staff who worked hard to give them this opportunity to perform. I am sure that those parents and families that came to watch, would agree with me that these showcase events are wonderful to see the talents of so many of our college students.

This term we say goodbye to some Wyvern teachers who will be leaving us from tomorrow: to Mrs Barclay and Mrs Culverhouse in Science, to Mr Fulford in Art, Mr Ness in Music and Mrs Wynn in PE. We will be thanking them for their contributions to Wyvern tomorrow afternoon, after the students leave for the end of term at 12.30pm.

I am pleased to report that we have been able to secure subject specialists for all the posts these staff have vacated. Our new PE teacher will not be able to join us until February half term, but we will have interim staffing in place for January to ensure the curriculum can continue to be taught. The other new members of staff will be joining us in January. Currently, there is a desperate shortage of teachers in the country. This is the case in all subject areas, but especially so in the core subjects. It is a reminder to college leaders, to students and parents that we all need to appreciate school staff and thank them for their work with our students.

- Miss Bartlett will be joining us to teach in English

Fair Oak Improvement Scheme

Updates on the Fair Oak improvements scheme. Milestone Infrastructure Ltd on behalf of Hampshire County Council will be undertaking investigatory highway works on Mortimers Lane, Winchester Road and Eastleigh Road in Fair Oak.

Schedule:

- Dates: Monday 6 January 2025 for 10 nights excluding weekends.
- Hours: 8pm to 6am (the road will reopen each morning).

The following works will be undertaken:

- Road and path surface testing;
- Drainage jetting (cleansing);
- CCTV inspection of existing drainage systems.

To enable the works to be undertaken in a safe manner, there will be road closures in place, which will depend on the location of the investigation works and will include:

- Mortimers Lane from the junction with Winchester Road to its junction with Michaels Way.
- Winchester Road (B3354 between a point opposite the Acorn Social Club to a point south of the four-way lights junction on Botley Road.
- Eastleigh Road (B3037 from its junction with Fratton Way to St Thomas Crescent on Stubbington Way.

A Gateman will be on site at closure points to provide access to all residents and emergency services. Pedestrian access will remain. There will be clear signage in place for the diversion route and this can be found on the scheme web page:

Post 16 Transport Consultation

This is a reminder that [Hampshire County Council's consultation on its Post 16 Transport Policy](#) is open until Sunday, 15 December.

The policy outlines the County Council's transport provision for young people over 16 with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) travelling to further education or training. The consultation seeks feedback on a number of small, proposed changes to make the policy easier to understand and provide greater clarity on how the service is delivered and managed. The proposals are not part of a savings programme.

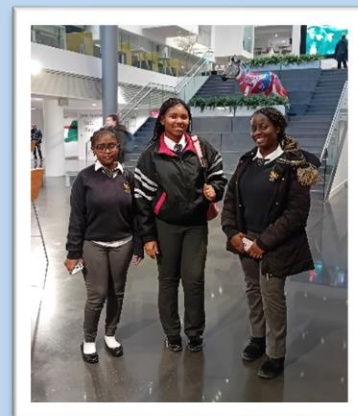
CAREERS NEWS

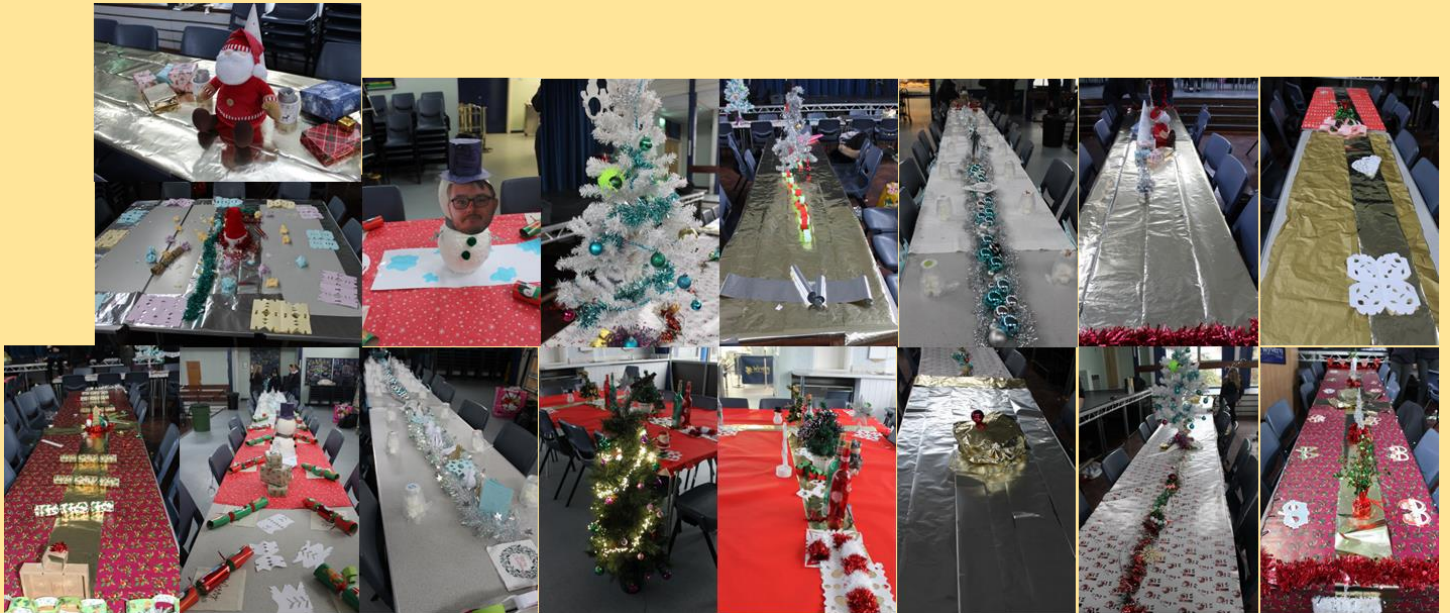
