Dear Parents/Carers

Happy new year to you and your family, I do hope you were able to enjoy the Christmas break. It was lovely to welcome students back to college on Tuesday, albeit with many looking tired due to return of the early morning getup. Hopefully, they will quickly adjust back to term time sleep patterns.

Teaching and Learning

Monday was INSET day for staff and the focus was on developing teachers' skills in making learning more active and collaborative, with students working together to share ideas, problem solve together and teach one another. We have some departments which really excel in this area, and they were able to share their expertise with colleagues. In the afternoon, teachers worked together to improve those parts of the curriculum which are less engaging, applying the approaches they had learned about in the morning.

We are focusing this year on improving two strands of teaching and learning: active learning (making students more active and less passive in class) and assessment for learning which means checking students understanding throughout lessons so that lessons do not move on before students are ready or long after they have ready. This week's INSET day focused on the first of these three priorities. Research shows that when students frequently engage in high quality group work and learn from one another, they can make an additional 5 months of progress in a subject within a year. Students remember only 10% of what they read and 20% of what they hear from 90% of what they say and do. We know that when they work in these ways with others, students develop their teamwork, communication, problem-solving and conflict resolution skills, and a lot more. Students who are often shy about sharing ideas in front of the whole class, are happier to share them and develop them in smaller groups. We are hoping to devote more time for teachers to develop their expertise in this and we hope that students will enjoy their learning more, as a result.

Safeguarding: Online Influencers

An influencer is somebody on a social media platform such as YouTube and Instagram, who have a high number of followers. Influencers share their opinions/ideas and may be paid to advertise/promote products through their account.

Whilst there are some great influencers who serve as positive and motivational role models for teenagers, there are some who choose to attract attention by sharing content that is for misogynistic, racist, or extremely misleading. These opinions can be expressed or interpreted as fact, so it is important to talk to your child and encourage them to fact check and critically analyse what they see and hear online.

Last term we did see a slight increase in racist, homophobic, and misogynistic comments being made. We work very hard to promote diversity and equality which the vast majority of our students embrace. However, we do have cases where students have been drawn into content that has encouraged them to say racist, homophobic and misogynistic comments with the intent to upset others. What students online see is influenced by algorithms, which predict what type of content they are most likely to interact with.

Whilst there are benefits of algorithms, it can mean that once they start looking at certain content, their social media feed can become more aligned with that opinion, creating an echo chamber and therefore they do not see a balanced picture. Attendance: Progress and Celebration

We're proud to share some fantastic news: in the week of 2nd December, we recorded our highest weekly attendance of the year so far. A huge thank you to all the students, families, and staff who made this happen—it's a real team effort.

At the start of last term, Wyvern's attendance was 1.5% below the national average, but thanks to everyone's hard work, we've now closed that gap to 0.3%. This progress is something to celebrate, and we know that with your continued support, this term we can go even further.

Our Commitment to Supporting Families

We know that attendance can sometimes be a challenge. Whether it's due to illness, anxiety, or practical struggles, life happens—and we're here to support you. Reaching out early can make a big difference, and we're grateful to all the parents who've already worked with us to address issues as they arise.

To help students stay motivated, we celebrate good attendance regularly. Each week, students with 100% attendance and punctuality earn P1s. Those with no unauthorised absences (and who meet other previously published behaviour criteria) can look forward to our summer Paultons Park trip (for Years 7-10), and we'll soon be sending out praise postcards to students who achieved perfect attendance in the Autumn Term.

Tips for Supporting Attendance at Home

Strong attendance starts with good habits. Here are some small steps that can make a big difference:

- **Routines:** Set consistent homework routines, bedtimes and morning schedules to make school days run smoothly.
- **Preparation:** Get clothes, bags, and lunches ready the night before to ease morning stress.
- **Healthy Habits:** Encourage a balanced diet, regular exercise, and limited screen time in the evenings to support physical and mental well-being.
- **Open Conversations:** Talk to your child about how they're feeling, and let us know if there's anything they're worried about.

Looking Ahead

Nationally, attendance remains a challenge, with 21% of students classified as 'persistently absent.' At Wyvern,

we're matching this national trend, but we're determined to improve. Together, we can help students overcome barriers to attending regularly, setting them up for success both now and in the future. We're excited for what's ahead this term and look forward to working closely with you. Fair Oak Improvement Scheme

Updates on the Fair Oak improvements scheme. Milestone Infrastructure Ltd on behalf of Hampshire County Council will be undertaking investigatory highway works on Mortimers Lane, Winchester Road and Eastleigh Road in Fair Oak.

Schedule:

- Dates: Monday 6 January 2025 for 10 nights excluding weekends.
- Hours: 8pm to 6am (the road will reopen each morning).

The following works will be undertaken:

- Road and path surface testing;
- Drainage jetting (cleansing);
- CCTV inspection of existing drainage systems.

To enable the works to be undertaken in a safe manner, there will be road closures in place, which will depend on the location of the investigation works and will include:

- Mortimers Lane from the junction with Winchester Road to its junction with Michaels Way.
- Winchester Road (B3354 between a point opposite the Acorn Social Club to a point south of the four-way lights junction on Botley Road.
- Eastleigh Road (B3037 from its junction with Fratton Way to St Thomas Crescent on Stubbington Way.

A Gateman will be on site at closure points to provide access to all residents and emergency services. Pedestrian access will remain. There will be clear signage in place for the diversion route and this can be found on the scheme web page:
