Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy second week of term with students out on trips to Fort Nelson and Marwell; rehearsals for the college production of the Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe; Year 11 students undertaking practical coursework days in Design technology and the police coming into college tomorrow to deliver further knife crime awareness assemblies to students. I have been very pleased with how well students have returned to college after Christmas, we have seen better attendance and a continuation of the improved behaviour we saw last half term. Thank you for supporting the college on these two issues.


Following our INSET day on teaching and learning last week, it has been a pleasure to see so many more interactive lessons tasks taking place on my daily walkabout of the college. We will continue to reflect on how we can make lessons more engaging with students collaborating with others. Last night, further staff training took place to build on the INSET day and staff were sharing the approaches and tasks they have tried out.

OfCom has published its research into online activities of adults and children in the UK. It is fascinating reading, and you can see it in full here <u>Online Nation 2024 report</u> I will not share with you the findings of adult online activity from the report except to say that the average adult in their 30s and 40s spends over 4 hours per day on their smartphone! Here are some of the findings related to child online activity, which help us all better understand the current online issues for teenagers:

- 22% of 8-17-year-olds had a social media user profile age of 18+ on at least one social media platform, meaning they are at greater risk of seeing adult content.
- Teenage girls are much more concerned than boys of the same age about sexual or pornographic content (67% vs 48%), misogynistic content (60% vs 51%), and violent content (64% vs 52%), as well as content promoting self-harm (75% vs 59%), or excessive or unhealthy dieting/exercise (51% vs 37%).
- Teenage boys are more likely than girls to encounter content showing dangerous stunts (29% vs 19%).
- Girls more commonly experience online harms relating to body image, including content stigmatising certain body types (25% vs 11%); content promoting excessive or unhealthy eating/exercise (19% vs 9%); group shaming (19% vs 10%) and eating disorder-related content (17% vs 5%).
- Teenage girls are more likely than boys to say they'd experienced unwelcome friend or follow requests (33% vs 21%).

These figures inform us about the gender differences in online activity and therefore the different dangers that boys and girls are exposed to and worry about. It is extremely concerning that so many children worry about and see sexual, violent, misogynistic, and self-harming content and are doing so because they are able to register as adults on social media sites that are not designed for them.

From next month, tech firms will have to start acting, under new online safety laws, to protect children online - starting with tackling the most harmful, illegal content. They are due to provide us with more guidance on how they are going to make online life safer for women and girls, and new Codes of Practice to protect children. We will keep you updated on this.
