### MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear parents and carers,

I continue to be impressed with how well students have started this academic year. Year 7, I must say, have been exemplary. They are well presented, polite, friendly and appear to be enjoying being part of the Wyvern family. Their teachers are delighted with them and feel they could not have made a better start. It has been heart-warming to see so many of the older students offering to help them find their classrooms and show them kindness. Staff are reporting that across all year groups there has been improved standards of behaviour; I believe that our new approach to praise & rewards, as well as our new and more flexible structures for classing students, have made a difference. However, I also know that you have been instrumental in supporting our policies on uniform and expectations too. Thank you so much for ensuring your children are wearing the correct uniform, looking smart and have the correct equipment for learning.

Although term has only just started, we do have a shortened week for students next week. We have our annual open evening on Thursday 19th September which means the college will close early at 1.25pm (at the end of period 4). We then have our INSET day on Friday 20th. Many schools have two Inset days at the start of term for staff to familiarise themselves with all the information about the students they will be teaching but we like to have one ours a couple of week after the start so that staff can plan their interventions, in-class support work and their lessons, having met the students and not just looking at their names.

We have begun the academic year with a new, restructured senior leadership team and I would like to share with you which members of the team are leading on different responsibilities and overseeing the different year groups. Although I do meet with lots of parents every week, and enjoy doing so, it is not possible for me to see everyone who would like to address issues with me. I hope that in sharing the names and responsibilities of the senior team, you can contact the senior leader who is best placed to answer any questions or concerns you might have:

Mr Stocks is the Senior Deputy Headteacher. He line manages the Year 11 Pastoral Office, with oversight of Year 11 behaviour, attendance and pastoral issues. Linked to this, he also manages careers, the exams team and post-16 transition to colleges. He leads on assessment in years 9-11, with the setting of academic targets for students (minimum expected grades) and reports to parents with assessment data for years 9-11. He ensures students have appropriate courses throughout key stage 4 by managing the options' process in year 8.

<u>Mr Emeny is the Deputy Headteacher for Pastoral and Culture</u>. He leads the whole college pastoral systems and policies, oversees their implementation in Years 9-11. He directly line manages the Year 9 pastoral team, with oversight of Year 9 behaviour, attendance and pastoral issues. His whole school

responsibilities include our approaches to attendance behaviour, the house system, praise, rewards and liaison with the Bridge Education Centre. He also leads on engaging parents and chairs the Friends of Wyvern committee. He is also a member of the safeguarding team and works in partnership with other schools and agencies to get students the help they need with pastoral issues.

Mrs Goss is the Assistant Headteacher for Pastoral, overseeing the implementation of attendance, behaviour, anti-bullying and pastoral policies for Key Stage 3 – Years 7 and 8. She line manages the pastoral teams for Years 7 and 8 and also leads our transition work with the feeder junior schools so that students in Key Stage 2 are well prepared and start positively with us in Year 7. She is a member of the safeguarding team and within this role has specific responsibility for children who are in care. She leads the college's' work on supporting students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Mrs Foster is the Assistant Headteacher for Teaching and Learning. She leads our work on designing the curriculum for the whole college and for individual departments; as well as ensuring the planned curriculum in these areas is taught and delivered effectively. This includes oversight of staff training. She has responsibility for the academic elements of the Key Stage 3 curriculum – assessment, reporting and interventions. She line manages the transition curriculum, for students who join us below age related expectations in literacy. She also leads on the tutor time curriculum.

<u>Mr Langdon is the Lead Practitioner for Teaching and Learning</u>. His role involves him identifying best practice in teaching and learning within the college and beyond it, sharing this practice with all teachers and leading our quality assurance of teaching and learning in lessons through observations and learning walks. He is often in lessons observing what is happening and giving feedback to staff on what is working well and how they can develop their skills further. He is developing the toolkit of effective teaching strategies to support this development.

<u>Mr Westlake is the Business Manager</u> who leads financial planning and budgeting. He oversees the development of the college site, facilities, infrastructure, health & safety and IT. He leads the community enterprise aspect of the college's work which is our business arm, offering sporting and leisure activities, facilities hire and our nursery. He is the events and trips co-ordinator, ensuring that off-site activities are well planned and effectively risk assessed. He is therefore also part of the safeguarding team.

<u>Miss Parker is Wyvern's Designated Safeguarding Lead</u>. She therefore leads the safeguarding team which works with social services, the police and other agencies to ensure that students are safe and that any threats to their safety are dealt with effectively. She has a medical background and as such line manages the welfare team and has responsibility for health care plans and medical needs. She line manages the Year 11 Pastoral Office, with oversight of Year 11 behaviour, attendance and pastoral issues. She is also the timetable, constructing the college timetable for staff and students.


