Paulton's Park Praise Trip Update

We are delighted to share some additional details regarding the exciting praise trips to Paulton's Park happening during the summer term. These trips celebrate students who consistently demonstrate outstanding effort, punctuality, attendance, and behaviour.

Trips will be taking place on the following dates:

- Years 7 and 9: Friday, 20th June 2025
- Years 8 and 10: Tuesday, 24th June 2025

To be eligible, students must meet the following selection criteria between October half-term (2024) and 16th May 2025:

- No unauthorised absences
- 97% or higher punctuality to lessons
- No truancy
- No more than 3 C3 sanctions
- No C4 sanctions
- An average PRIDE score of 7 or higher in their summer term PRIDE reports (PRIDE scores are out of 10 this year)

Parents and carers can monitor unauthorised absences via the attendance section of Edulink or through the half-termly absence reports. Currently, just over 600 students are on track to receive an invitation. We have secured discounted entry tickets from Paulton's Park and are currently obtaining quotes for coach travel. The trip will be offered at cost price, anticipated to be between £40-£60 per student. Subsidised support will be available on a case-by-case basis for students eligible for Pupil Premium.

We wanted to provide this early update to allow you to plan ahead and start setting aside savings for this special reward trip. A final price will be confirmed in due course.
