MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear parents and carers,

Thank you for accommodating the college’s early closure today to enable us to get ready for this evening’s open evening. This is an important event for the college as it helps the families of Year 6 children decide whether Wyvern is the right school for them and helps the Year 6 students themselves get ready for secondary school. I was impressed that almost 250 Wyvern students volunteered to help us out with this event. That is almost 20% or one in every five students at the college. It is a shame we cannot have them all with us tonight, but I’m pleased so many wanted to help the staff and the Year 6 students and I hope those who could not will get the chance to do so next year.

Community Surveys

Today, Eastleigh Borough Council is launching *Together We Make Eastleigh*, a new project in partnership with Hemingway Design to shape the future of Eastleigh town centre. As part of this initiative, they invite you to take part in an online survey where you can share your thoughts on what you love, dislike, and what improvements you'd like to see in our local town. Bloor Homes, which is bringing forward proposals for a new housing scheme on land off Mortimer’s Lane, Fair Oak, are also after your views. Their development will include up to 250 new homes, as well as a potential multi-functional space, creating sustainable places for both people and nature. In response to feedback received during the public consultation, they are collecting insights from young people in the area, to inform how they design and provide places to play and socialise. Safeguarding

The safeguarding team has been very busy this week. The safeguarding team is made up of 12 members of staff who have specialist training in how to manage and respond to a wide range of safeguarding issues. Students can talk to a preferred trusted adult in college about any of their problems – it does not have to be a member of the safeguarding team. However, these staff will pass onto the safeguarding team things students have disclosed to them and we will then follow up.

The safeguarding team is led by Miss Parker who is our Designated Safeguarding lead and there are several deputy leads: Mrs Emeny, Mr Emeny, Mrs Gilbert, Mrs Goss, Mrs Kennedy, Mr Merriman, Mrs Munday, Miss Stedman, Mrs Strand, Mrs Taylor-Watson, Mr Westlake and me.

The safeguarding team has been very busy over the last two weeks and what we are seeing is, once again, problems caused by unregulated access to social media and the internet, with children accessing age-inappropriate content. There is not a "type" of student who does this and many parents have been surprised when we have contacted them to tell them about safeguarding issues as their child is not "the type" to be involved in these. Every child with unregulated access to social media forums and the internet is at risk of the following safeguarding issues: sexting, sextortion, grooming, predators, pornography, extreme pornography, trolling, cyber-bullying, phishing, hazing, fake news, hate speech, self-harm glorification, suicide promotion, identity theft, prejudicial influencers, dark web, exploitation and radicalisation. This list may sound alarmist but actually we know these things can happen in our community because they do happen in it and the safeguarding team deal with these issues.

We can and do teach students about these issues and our mobile phone restrictions at college prevent students from encountering these during college hours. However, we cannot police what students do at home on their screens and that is not our role either. We do need you to do this please. In the weekly newsletter I often give safeguarding advice around different issues and topics but if I could give only one piece of advice it would be to regularly check what your child is doing online, especially in social media forums which have age restrictions of 16 precisely because users can be victim to the issues I have just listed AND to also put controls onto your child's phones to restrict their access to inappropriate content.
