### MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear parents and carers,

Tomorrow is National Teaching Assistants' Day, a day when we show our appreciation for the work that TAs do in support of students and teachers. We are very fortunate to have TAs at Wyvern who are highly skilled and very dedicated. If you would like to thank a TA who has supported your child, then please do email this to them. #### **Extra-Curricular**

Our extra-curricular events programme is in full swing, and I would urge you to encourage your child to get involved in at least one of the enrichment opportunities we offer. Extra-curricular clubs include clubs linked to taught subjects such as History, IT, Music Tech and STEM (Science and engineering); clubs set up by students to share personal interests, such as chess, dungeons & dragons, Pokémon, colouring and Yu-gi-oh; sports activities which can lead to competitions; performing arts opportunities in drama, dance, and music which can lead to public performances. Getting your child involved in extra-curricular activities – whether it is inside school or outside - gives them confidence, a sense of self-worth, sense of achievement, positive friendships across ages built on common interests; it gets them positive attention from those who share their interests, and all these things enables them to resist – to protect themselves- from negative peer pressure. The "Grow" part of the Wyvern motto of Think, Grow Care, is all about personal development and helping students expand their interests and friendships because we know this is central to them living lives that are happy and enjoyable.

## Super-curricular

In addition to our extra-curricular activities, there is also our super-curricular programme of academic enrichment. # Safeguarding – Body Image and Self Esteem

We need to empower young people to develop positive body image as a key to personal wellbeing. One of the reasons we do not permit students to use phones during the college day is because too much time online, particularly in social media, affects their mental health.

Selfies can become a comparison tool; students who see a constant stream of perfect bodies can put unrealistic expectations on themselves to look a certain way and to hate the way their body does not conform to this narrow view of beauty.

Wanting to be accepting by others who do conform to this view of beauty can pressure young people into posting the perfect selfie to improve their social standing. They may place too high a value on how others see them; getting less likes than others or getting a negative comment posted online can be quite destructive to those who seek their self-worth through social media.

We need to work together on this issue of selfies, self-esteem, and body image. There are many things you can do to ensure your child maintains a healthy body image and high self-esteem when using their devices. Help them think critically about the images they see, understanding that the images they look of others online are idealised and photoshopped images that are not real, typical, or normally; that an attractive selfie is probably the 100th selfie that person has taken of themselves.

Encourage them to be selective about who they follow and the images they see. They can think perfection is normal if they are bombarded by images of people with certain body shapes and sizes. Empower them not to put all self-esteem eggs in the same basket; that they are more than what they see in the mirror; encourage them to find value in the range of different personal qualities and talents they have. Talk positively about your own body image, being mindful that the language you use when talking about your own body will affect how they perceive theirs.




