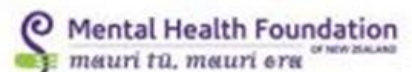

INTRODUCE THESE SIMPLE STRATEGIES INTO YOUR LIFE AND YOU WILL FEEL THE BENEFITS.



With years 7 and 8 we have focused on the “give” and the “connect” sections and taught them the concept of Ubuntu, a South African philosophy. Ubuntu is the idea that you can only be fully human and enjoy life to the full by having connections and good relations with all those you come into contact with: not just the people we like (our friends) but everyone. Ubuntu means You can't be human by yourself, but only by sharing your life with others and sharing in their lives too. *Oomootoo ingarmootoo ingabantoo* translates as “You are a person through other people.”

As you will know the school motto is Think, Grow, care and the “Grow” bit is all about students being happy and fulfilled individuals. This can only happen if students fulfil the “Care” bit – by connecting and serving others through friendship and teamwork. Students have been reminded that they have the power to affect people's mental health for the better or worse by the way they treat them.

On a more practical note, I would like to share with you some of the best resources I have seen on supporting good mental health. They are free and produced by the Mental Health Foundation and can be found here: [Publications | Mental Health Foundation](#). There are concise and very useful guides on the following: how to manage anxiety and fear; how to manage and reduce stress; how to sleep better; looking after your mental

health through exercise; looking after your mental health through mindfulness. These are well worth a quick look now so you know where support is should you or a family member need it.

We have been pleased to connect with lots of you at our recent parental events: the Year 11 parents' evening on Tuesday, the year 9 and 10 PE Information Evening and the Year 6 admission tours (we know some of you have younger children joining us in September). We have further parental events in the weeks ahead: Year 11 information evening for English, Maths and Science, Year 9 parents' evening and revision evening.

Thank you to those of you who attend these events; we hope they help you learn how to support your child's education.
