This week has yet again given me reason to be extremely proud of our students. This week, we have really noticed the dark and cold mornings and evenings. Please do check your child's bike if they are cycling to college to ensure it has lights and that they are wearing a helmet.

Please do ensure your child has a coat to wear to and from college when it is cold and wet. We do not permit hoodies to be worn in college; we have kept a high standard on uniform because we know it can be very divisive when some students wear fashionable variations of inform items or expensive branded or logoed items. This creates fashion trends which others are pressured into following and it puts on public display for all to see those who are wealthy and those who are not.

Social media has already made many students feel they are not good enough and we need to ensure that fashion wear in college does not reinforce this feeling. We also know that the colder weather brings more illness.

I am concerned that for the first time in 4 years Wyvern students' attendance is below the national average for attendance. Since we are now in the part of the year when people are most likely to be ill from cold, flu and other illnesses. I thought I would clarify the expectations around when students are expected to be in college.

Every young person experiences common illnesses from time to time; most of these do not need time away from college.

Students should only stay away from college due to illness if:

1. They have an infectious illness which could spread to other people.

2. They are so unwell that they could not cope in lessons

The guidance from the NHS is summarised here:

Chickenpox	Keep your child at home until all the spots have crusted over.
Common cold	Keep your child at home if they also have a fever.
Conjunctivitis	Get advice from a pharmacist about how to manage.
Cough	
Ear Infection	If severe <u>of</u> with a high temperature, keep your child at home.
Hand, foot, mouth disease	
High temperature or fever	
Impetigo	Needs anti-biotics from a GP. Can go to college 48 hours after treatment starts.
Ringworm	See a pharmacist unless it's on their scalp – see a GP. Can come to college once they've started their treatment.
Scarlet Fever	Needs anti-biotics from a GP. Can come to college 24 hours after starting anti-biotics.
Sore throat	If they have a high temperature with it, then keep at home.
Threadworms	Get advice from a pharmacist.
Vomiting and diarrhoea	Only come back to college after 48 hours since the last episode of vomit or diarrhoea,

I hope that you will find this useful.
