Message from the Headteacher

Dear parents and carers,

It has been a good week at Wyvern. We have had feedback that the students who went on the battlefields trip stood out amongst other schools for their exemplary behaviour and courtesy at the sites and on the boat home.

On Tuesday, we were finally able to schedule in Sports Day; we had some rain just as we got started and then some more after we had finished and the students back inside. It was wonderful to have years 7, 8 and 9 all out together on the track side to witness some great performances. Students had also competed in the longer distances and field events earlier in the week. There were three groups of students who impressed me. Firstly, those who, given the chance to shine in front of their peers, did so with remarkable physical performances, winning events and house points. Secondly, those students who took part because their house needed someone to and although they would have preferred not to, did it anyway for their house. Thirdly, the spectators who encourages, clapped, cheered, and supported the performances. It was an inclusive sports day with students of all aptitudes taking part and it was so humbling and heart-warming to see the spectators cheering the loudest for those whose needs make sport so much more difficult than for others. With our motto of "think grow, care," we have been working with students to develop empathy and support for each other and I was so proud to see this on display on sports day.

We have had our summer concerts taken place this week, yesterday and tonight. I would like to congratulate the students who entertained parents and friends of Wyvern with their performances. It is also heart-warming to see students from different year groups coming together to support each other.

In the last three weeks we have seen a deterioration in uniform, and this is especially the case with footwear. Normandy Battlefields Trip

80 Year 9 and Year 10 students visited the Battlefields of Normandy last week to learn about the events of D-Day. Coming just after the 80th anniversary of the invasion of Normandy by Allied forces in June 1944, this was a particularly poignant time to visit.

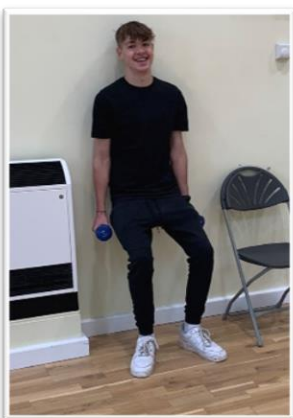
Students visited locations such as the American Airborne Museum in Sainte-Mère-Église, the sites of British beach landings at Gold beach and German, American and British cemeteries for those who lost their lives in the Battle of Normandy. This culminated in a ceremony of remembrance and a wreath laying at Ranville Military Cemetery.

Students were an absolute credit to Wyvern and their behaviour was exemplary. They were interested, enthusiastic and engaged in the history but also cheered very loudly when England defeated the Netherlands in the Euros Semi-Final (let's gloss over Sunday's result).

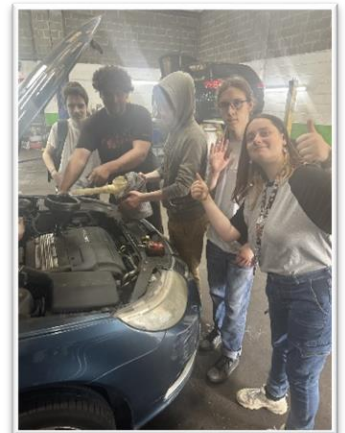
Year 10 Goes to Work!
