
If you see one of our DNOs or PCSOs knocking at your door, please spare a few minutes to talk to

# Man from Hedge End arrested on suspicion of harassment

A 73-year-old man from Hedge End has been arrested on suspicion of harassment without violence.

It follows an incident reported to police in January.

The man was detained in Hedge End on Thursday 18 April by officers from Hedge End Neighbourhood Policing Team.



# Man charged with seven shoplifting offences in Chandler's Ford, Totton and Southampton

A 39-year-old man is due to appear in court today having been charged with seven shoplifting offences across Southampton, Totton and Chandler's Ford.

James Robert Simpson, of Hill Lane, has been charged with seven counts of theft from a shop in connection with the following incidents:

- On April 6<sup>th</sup> various products worth £123 were taken from the One Stop store on Cumbrian Way in Southampton.
- On April 13<sup>th</sup>, items to the value of £75 were taken from Asda on Millbrook Road West, Southampton.
- On April 14<sup>th</sup>, £134 worth of products were taken from the One Stop on Park Road in Southampton.
- On April 22<sup>nd</sup> meat and laundry items worth £146.12 were taken from the Morrison's service station on Spruce Drive in Totton.
- On May 1<sup>st</sup> £500 worth of perfume and medication was taken from Park Pharmacy in Chandler's Ford.
- On May 1<sup>st</sup> meat and cheese worth £279.50 was taken from the One Stop on Park Road in Southampton. On May 2<sup>nd</sup> chocolate and confectionary worth £362.42 was taken from the same store.

Simpson has been remanded into custody and is due to appear at Southampton Magistrates' Court today (Monday 13 May).



# Man and woman from Southampton charged with shoplifting offences

A man and woman from Southampton have been charged in connection with shoplifting offences in Bursledon, Netley and Hedge End.

Jody Kahlid Moylette, 40, of International Way, Southampton was arrested on Friday 26 April.

He was later charged with two shopliftings and

appeared at Southampton Magistrates' Court the following day (Saturday 27 April).

The charges relate to reported incidents at Next, Charles Watts Way, Hedge End on Monday 8 April and One Stop, Portsmouth Road, Bursledon on Saturday 30 March.

Jodie Marie McDermott, 34, of International Way, Southampton has been arrested and charged with three shopliftings.

The charges against McDermott relate to reported incidents at Co-op, Station Road, Netley on Wednesday 27 March, One Stop, Portsmouth Road, Bursledon on Saturday 30 March and Next, Charles Watts Way, Hedge End on Monday 8 April.



# Three men arrested in connection with investigation into Hampshire burglary series

Officers investigating a series of burglaries across Hampshire have now arrested three people after spotting and stopping a vehicle believed to be involved in criminal activity.

The series being investigated by officers relates to reported incidents in Eastleigh, Southampton, Chandler's Ford, Chilworth, Winchester and Basingstoke, between Saturday 2 March and Saturday 20 April.

A 27-year-old man from Peterborough, Cambridgeshire and a 26-year-old man from Sleaford, Lincolnshire have been arrested on suspicion of burglary dwelling – with intent to steal.

A 27-year-old man from Peterborough was arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to commit a burglary dwelling with intent to steal.

He was also arrested on suspicion of driving a motor vehicle dangerously, driving a motor vehicle otherwise than in accordance with a licence, using a motor vehicle without third party insurance, driving a motor vehicle with a proportion of a specified controlled drug above the specified limit and driving a vehicle whilst unfit through drugs. Two vehicles were also seized by officers.

The man was also detained on suspicion of driving whilst disqualified and driving a motor vehicle otherwise than in accordance with a licence.



# Dispersal order authorised for parts of Eastleigh

A 12-hour dispersal order was in force for parts of Eastleigh, from midday on Saturday 20 April until 12am on Sunday 21 April.

The order, under Section 34 of the Antisocial Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act (2014), covered the following areas:

- Stoneham Lane
- Lakeside Country Park area
- The area in and around Eastleigh Football Club's Silverlake Stadium
- The town centre, including train stations Airport Parkway and Eastleigh

The order, which was authorised to help tackle any issues and keep local communities safe, gave our officers the power to order a person to leave the areas concerned with no return within the specified time period.

It also gave officers the power to seize anything used in the commission of ASB.

Anyone who refused to comply with the order would have been committing a criminal offence and be liable for arrest.

Inspector Andy Mooge, said, "This order was authorised to cover the time before, during and after the football match between Eastleigh FC and FC Halifax Town.

"It was in response to previous match days where a minority of individuals had actively sought to engage in disorder.

"The purpose of the dispersal order was to allow peaceful enjoyment of the match by all those attending.

"The tactics used were a robust measure to keep the public safe and ensure local people's lives weren't disrupted."

The match passed without incident.

ONE IN CUSTODY: Good afternoon. Hope you're all well. We've just got some news to bring you on a very recent arrest.

A 39-year-old man from Hedge End was arrested by officers shortly after midday today (Tuesday 30 April) on suspicion of breach of a restraining order. He is currently in police custody. #Arrest



ARREST: Further to our last post, we have news of another arrest, this time from West End yesterday afternoon (Monday 29 April).
