## Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Once again there has been a great deal of extra-curricular activity taking place this week: Year 10 Geographers have undertaken field work at Sandbanks in Dorset; the History Club has visited the Fountains Cafe to receive its trophy and award for winning local History competition; the first ever Wyvern Variety Show will be performed this evening; the Duke of Edinburgh practice camps are about to take place and our athletes are competing in the district championships. Year 10 students have begun their revision work for the upcoming exams and of course year 11 continue to site their GCSE exams.

It has not been so busy though that we have forgotten to commemorate D-Day. Today is the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this momentous event which was a significant turning point in the Second World War. In my assemblies I have reminded students what happened on D-Day, shared with them veterans' personal testimonies and reflected on what we can learn from the men who fought on the Normandy beaches. Every time we do some form of remembrance work with the students, I am impressed with how appropriately they respond: with a keen interest in learning about what happened, a deep reverence for those who served our country with such courage and conviction and a willingness to learn the lessons we can from these events and experiences.

A key message is that people can achieve extraordinary things if they can endure hardship, show courage, be bold as well as resilient, believe in themselves and stick together. I have talked to students about the true meaning of bravery: not the absence of fear but on the contrary, the facing and overcoming of fear.

The NHS Careers day will take place on 21st August at University Hospital Southampton 21st August 2024 9am-3pm.

This programme is open to all students aged 15 & 16 studying/living in Hampshire, however there are places set aside for students who meet 2 widening participation criteria. The criteria are:

- o Parents, guardian or self in receipt of a means tested benefit
- o Young people looked after by a Local Authority or you have been in care or looked after for three months or more
- o In receipt of 16-19 bursary or similar grant
- o Resident in an area with a postcode which falls within the lowest 20% of the IMD (Index of Multiple Deprivation), or a member of a travelling family.
- o In receipt of free school meals at any time during (normally for a minimum period of at least one school term/2 months.)
- o Participation in a recognised outreach or widening participation programme

We only have 20 places available for this day. So, if your students would like to participate in NHS careers day please ask them to complete the form below by midday on Friday 19th June. - **Trial Exams.** Year 10 students will begin their year 10 trial exams on Tuesday 11th June 2024 through to Thursday 20th June 2024. In a recent assembly (Friday 24th May) we shared the details of the exam period and the format they will take to ensure students are clear on the schedule and the way in which the examinations will be conducted. Students know that examinations begin as they enter the 'venue' and that no communication or disturbance can be permitted.

This year the exams will all be conducted in the Sports Hall or classrooms for students with access arrangements, so that they become familiarised with the venue in which they will sit their public examinations a year from now. These examinations will allow us to assess students' performance on full GCSE papers in full GCSE conditions, thereby helping us provide quality, up to date information regarding their current position and an up-to-date projected final grade for the end of Y11.
