# Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers.

# Dear parents,

As the general election campaigns gather momentum, many different policies and issues have been debated. I thought it would be useful this week to summarise, in alphabetical order, what the parties have published about their plans for education. I have tried to do this impartially, by summarising what the parties themselves say. I do so with the aim of encouraging you to include education in your thinking about how to vote, rather than trying to influence your thinking on which party would be better for education.

#### Conservative education policy

- Ban students from using mobile phones during the school day.
- Provide bonuses for teachers in subjects where there is a shortage of teachers.
- Require all students to do two hours of PE every week.
- Introduce the Advanced British Standard, a compulsory sixth form curriculum which requires all students to study at least 5 subjects, rather than the traditional three.
- Provide more special schools to educate children with SEND.
- Create a modern version of national service, made up of either a year-long placement in the armed forces or 25 weekend days of community service.
- Close university courses with the worst success rates.

#### Green Party's education policy

- Increase school funding by £8bn, to include £2bn pay uplift for teachers.
- End university tuition fees and restore maintenance grant to university students.
- End "high-stakes testing" at primary and secondary schools.
- Abolish OFSTED.

#### Labour education policy

- Recruit 6,500 more teachers and a mental health specialist in every school, paid for by charging VAT on private school fees.
- Introduce free breakfast clubs in every primary school

- Broaden the curriculum by ensuring vocational and creative subjects are included in school performance measures.
- Reform Ofsted, replacing one-word judgements on schools with a "report card" of information.
- Identify special education needs earlier.
- Focus on developing students' speaking and listening skills.

#### Liberal Democrat education policy

- Place a specialist trained mental health professional in every school, funded by taxing social media companies.
- Increase school funding to above the rate of inflation.
- Provide every child from a disadvantaged background with a "tutoring guarantee."
- Giving an extra free five hours of early years education to disadvantaged 3-4 year olds.
- Reinstate maintenance grants for university students from disadvantaged backgrounds.
- Give greater status to the arts and vocational courses.

## Reform's education policy

- Double the number of pupil referral units so disruptive students leave mainstream schools and get more support.
- Ban smart phones in schools
- Increase tax relief on private school fees.
- Restrict numbers studying at university
- Increase apprenticeships and technical courses
- Introduce life skills lessons including home economics and social media risk.
- Ban gender questioning and student choice of pronouns.

#### Options Update

On Wednesday this week I visited Year 8 assembly to update students on Options for next academic year. After a lot of work behind the scenes we have now finalised the timetable for next year ensuring that as many students as possible receive their option choices.

As is always the case there are a small number of students whose combination cannot work and I have started to hold individual meeting with those students and speak with parents.

In addition, there are two oversubscribed courses - Citizenship and Business & Enterprise. In the coming week I will see those who put these courses forward as their 4th or 3rd preference and agree a replacement subject (in most cases their reserve choice). In all cases I will liaise with parents before allocating another subject.

When this process has been completed I plan to issue a slip to every student confirming the 4 subjects they will be assigned next year. If there are any questions about options please do not hesitate to contact me.
