Dear Parents and Carers,

Mental health workshop for parents

We work closely with the local Mental Health Support Team which is offering an online parental workshop on low mood and depression. The MHST invite you to take part and say this about the session: "the workshop will be mostly informative, with some optional opportunities for discussion, input, and questions via the digital chat function. You will not need to have your video-camera or microphone on for the workshop. The workshop aims to upskill parents and carers to understand low mood and depression, the signs, and symptoms of this in young people, and provide some simple skills and strategies for you to take away and use to support your young person who may be struggling with their mood. This terms workshop will take place on the 13th August 2024 (5.30pm until 7.00pm) and the Zoom details are as follows:

Safeguarding

Globally there has been an increase in reports of children and young people being victims of financially motivated sexual extortion, often referred to in the media as 'sextortion'. The National Crime Agency's CEOP Education have issued an alert in education settings across the UK in response to this threat.

The alert will help professionals/carers to:

- Recognise and understand financially motivated sexual extortion
- > Raise awareness and help seeking behaviours amongst children and young people

- > Give suitable messaging and support to parents and carers
- > Support victims of financially motivated sexual extortion

Financially motivated sexual extortion involves children and young people being forced into paying money or meeting another financial demand (such as purchasing a pre-paid gift card) after an offender has threatened to release nudes or semi-nudes of them. It is a type of online blackmail and also a form of child sexual abuse. Financially motivated sexual extortion is usually carried out by organised crime groups based overseas who are typically motivated by money. These groups target all ages and genders however, a large proportion of cases have involved male victims aged 14-18.

It is really important that we work together to give students the message that sending nudes to other people online can lead to sextortion (as well as revenge porn), even if they think the person they are sending them to is someone they love and trust in a relationship with a boyfriend of girlfriend. Nude pictures do get distributed more widely and can fall into the hands of people who will use them for sextortation.

We have received a report that a Wyvern student walked out in front of moving traffic at the crossroad traffic lights in Fair Oak. The female student was completely oblivious as they stepped out, head down looking at the floor and was wearing over ear headphones, at no point did they look up or appear to notice the vehicle having to stop.

Please can we remind you to have a conversation with your young people about Road Safety.

Discuss the importance of not using a mobile phone or texting while crossing the road. Remind your child/young person that they cannot hear traffic if listening to music through earphones or see it properly if wearing a large hood, and to use the pedestrian crossings even if it involves having to walk a few more yards, waiting for the traffic to stop completely.

• Year 8 Comedy Workshop

Warning! Writers at Work! On Wednesday a group of Year 8 pupils took part in a writing workshop with a professional writer and broadcaster, Dave Smith. (<u>www.wordsmith-features.com</u>). The pupils enjoyed hearing about Dave's life and writing career, from jobbing stand-up touring the clubs of the UK with the likes of Michael McIntyre and Sean Lock, to writing travel blogs and radio broadcasts. Dave explained his writing process, and then challenged the pupils to write for a Radio Solent broadcast – 'The Best things...'. Pupils worked through the thinking and planning processes, and then generated their own comedic and observational texts, sharing them aloud with each other at the end of the day in an 'open-mike' session. Topics covered dads, football, being alone in the house on your own, mum's and dinner time, and pets, to name a few!

Here is a small sample of the work shared – more to come later: What an amazing afternoon, and such talent emerging in our younger years!!

"The moment when that wonderful dinner smell finally reaches your bedroom has to be the best smell in the world! After that smell arrives there's only one thing to do: to shout "Mum! How long until dinner?" The time from then until dinner has to be the slowest that time has ever gone. With a few minutes remaining and the smell stronger than ever, I feel like I'm on a gameshow called "Guess the food!". Finally mum shouts "Dinner's ready!". The race is on. I run to the stairs, descending 3 at a time. At the bottom, the final stretch appears: me, my sister and the cat all racing for food. We reach the kitchen only to find dinner still in pots and pans. A wave of disappointment knocks through us. Groans are released from the 3 of us as we realise that we have to lay the table. 10 minutes later, there is no more dinner; and the cat is a little bit ...bigger." Zach
