GCSE Full Course Suggested Reading/Film List

Judaism

• The Romance Reader by Pearl Abraham = A fictional story about a girl growing up within a strictly religious community who begins to question and rebel against the pull of family and faith.

Never Mind the Goldbergs by Matthue Roth = A humorous work of fiction that follows the journey made by an Orthodox Jewish teenager to Hollywood, leading her to question issues of faith, G-d and orthodoxy.

White Rose by Kip Wilson = This book tells the true story of Sophie Scholl who embarked upon a non-violent campaign against the Nazi regime.

- Rabbi, I Have A Problem ISBN: 9781870216159 = This book presents Reform and Orthodox responses to a variety of moral issues.
- The Diary of Anne Frank = A translation of the diary kept by Anne Frank while she was in hiding for two years with her family during the Nazi occupation of the Netherlands.

Christianity

- The Shack by William P. Young = A Fictional novel that explores issues of suffering and the nature of God/the Trinity.
- Run Baby Run by Nicky Cruz = Tells of the author's desperate battle against drugs, alcoholism, and a violent environment, as he searched for a better way of life on the streets of New York City.

General Interest

- Sophie's World by Jostein Gaarder = A fictional story about a girl who turns to philosophy to solve the riddles in her life but the truth is far stranger than she could have imagined. An addictive blend of mystery, philosophy and fantasy.
- My Sister's Keeper by Jodi Picoult = A book that will encourage you to question the value of human life and consider some of the dilemmas facing medical staff and families when someone is terminally ill.




• Puzzle of God by Peter Vardy = Whilst this book is usually used for A-Level studies, there's no harm in dipping into it now to broaden your understanding of the questions raised about the concept of God.



- Puzzle of Evil by Peter Vardy = Again, this is an A-Level text that will offer a deeper insight into questions surrounding evil and suffering in our world.
- God of the Big Bang by Leslie Wickman = This book explores the relationship between Judaeo-Christian beliefs about creation in light of scientific discoveries.

Films/TV Shows

- Famous and Fighting Crime is a show available on All4 that gives an insight into the working lives of the police in Cambridgeshire.
- Call the Midwife is a BBC production that is really useful at documenting how social attitudes towards relationships, contraception and abortion have changed in the UK since the 1950s.
- Alive tells the true story of a group of people that had to question some of their core values in order to survive. How far would you go?
- The Theory of Everything explores how Stephen Hawkins found meaning in life whilst rejecting the idea of God.



- Equilibrium = Would the world be better if we didn't have feelings? One man rises up against a regime that believes it is.
- Minority Report = This film will bring in to question your attitudes towards justice and crime prevention.
- The Secret Life of Bees = A moving exploration of race relations in 1960s America and the power of human determination.
- The Bucket List = Everybody approaches death differently and sometimes these differences can cause conflict.
- Black Hawk Down = Based on real events, this film raises questions about armed conflict and why people choose to fight.
- The Lorax = A fantastically light hearted look at the environmental impact of human actions.
- The Adjustment Bureau = A film exploring the idea of fate, free will and determinism.

- The Good Place A TV show exploring the afterlife and what qualifies people's entrance into it.
- The Vicar of Dibley It's a little old now but it's a fab show that explores themes or weddings, funerals, love, services and women's ordination in the Church of England.
- Lucifer A TV show that explores the themes of good and evil, the afterlife and the concept of angels (loosely based on some Christian concepts but note not all ideas from the show are based on the Bible).
